# LOGAN'S MEADOW **IMPROVEMENTS** GET THE GO AHEAD

Chesterton nature reserve will get long-awaited improvement works in the Spring

Works to improve biodiversity, paths and information at Logan's Meadow beside the River Cam in Chesterton will be carried out this Spring. Planning delays and unusually high rainfall last year postponed the improvementswhich were requested in a survey of local residents before 2020.

Secretary of the Friends of Logan's Meadow, Elizabeth May, explains: "The works will improve the biodiversity of the reserve. It will increase the amount of seasonal wetland and wet grassland, providing suitable habitat for birds including Reed Bunting, Common Sandpiper, Water Rail and Snipe. There will be an additional channel running from the riverside for otters, water voles and kingfishers."

Among the other exciting developments are a new Interpretation Trail, a new meandering gravel pathway, and boundary fences. All this will better connect our local green space with the riverside lands from Jesus Green to Wicken Fen.

The Friends of Logan's Meadow organise regular events on our local nature reserve. Their next confirmed event is: Amphibians evening - Fri. 14 March 6pm Meet by the Gym equipment.

## **FUNDING A LIFESAVER!**

Community fundraising has enabled a defibrillator to be installed at St Andrew's Hall



STEP INTO SPRING WITH

St Andrew's Hall is the newest venue in Chesterton to install a potentially life-saving community defibrillator — thanks to fundraising and donations by local people and match funding from the Department of Health and Social Care. Complete Electrics—a Cambridge-based local business—also installed the equipment for free as a gift to our community.

The defibrillator is situated to rear of the St Andrew's Hall, easily accessed from St Andrew's Churchyard and Chesterton Rec beyond. The benefits of having access to a defibrillator in our community are huge. There are more than 30,000 out-of-hospital cardiac arrests in the UK each year and currently less than 1 in 10 survive. Without immediate intervention with a defibrillator, most cardiac arrests are fatal. Every minute without CPR and a defibrillator a person's chance of survival is reduced by up to 10%. These machines save lives. The defibrillator is available to anyone who needs it in an emergency.

YOUTH AND CHILDREN FIND THEIR SINGING VOICES AT ST ANDREW'S CHURCH

Vicar Philip writes: Many readers of Chesterton News might remember themselves or members of their family learning to sing at St Andrew's Church—in the historic male-voice choir or the more recent girls and boys Youth Choir since the 1990s. Today, musical opportunities for children and young people are flourishing at St Andrew's Church once more.

Minims is our singing group for 4-8 year olds. It runs fortnightly on Sunday afternoons in St Andrew's Church, 4pm. It's a gentle and fun introduction to making music and singing techniques. The Minims sing a range of songs about God and faith, from lively action songs to calm reflective songs. Children often work together to make up words to additional verses, or have fun with percussion instruments. Every session, there are a few songs with sign language and others sung in a round or with simple harmony. Parents stay for the whole session and siblings are welcome to join in too, whether they're younger or older than the 4-8 age bracket.

**Youth Choir** is for 9-17 year olds. It runs weekly on Thursday evenings, 7-8pm, during school term time. Any level of experience is welcome. Sessions include vocal warm ups and learning fun and inspiring songs in a supportive atmosphere.

Do you remember 20th January this year? It was 'Blue Monday' – allegedly the most depressing day of the year. (Also the day of the inauguration of the 47th President of the United States of America, which I will refrain from commenting on).

The whole Blue Monday thing is a bit rubbish if you ask me. It seems to have started out maybe 20 years ago, linked to someone trying to encourage people to think about booking summer holidays, just a few weeks after Christmas and with winter darkness still lingering around us.

I discovered this year that the charity 'Samaritans' had a campaign running to encourage supporters to mark the 20th January as 'Brew Monday' instead. That sounds much more inspired to me. It was all about making time for a brew and a catch-up. Reaching out to others and spending time listening to one another whilst remembering that struggles with mental health don't happen on just any one, particular day or at any one time of the year. It set me thinking about making every Monday a Brew Monday?

My role as a Christian Minister leads me into conversations and partnerships with a wide range of organisations and activities that

keep going, week by week, in and around where we all live and work in Chesterton. Activities which set out to create safe and supportive spaces in which we can share our life stories and be encouraged when things feel tough. Just from me, I want to say thank you for those spaces and for the staff and volunteers that enable them. I know that our community is stronger because of them/you.

The Christian season of Lent will soon begin and preparations are made for the Feast of Easter. At the start of the season of Lent Christians discover again of the story of Jesus of Nazareth spending time in a wilderness. We read that there was mental struggle and a wrestling with the way forward for the future. That's always been a part of what it means to be human. There will be a celebration of life, new life, on Easter Day and the dawning of hope.

I'll be holding in my prayers all the many ways that people share hope with one another. Wishing everyone a happy, joyful and hopeful Easter when it dawns.
