Street pastors

Dorothy writes:

Some of you will remember we had a giving day for this local charity in the summer of 2012. After a talk by Chris Jenkin, 3 of our congregation then. Caroline Fisher, Judith Gardom and Mick Lumsden trained to become pastors. Judith and Mick are still serving, going out till 4am around the city centre nightclubs on Friday and Saturday nights. Liz Frayling-Cork has jointed the team which works in a café in St Columba's chapel on Saturday nights. This is really useful as a safe place for the pastors to take vulnerable people. There are over 60 volunteers. I am now Chair of the trustees. Cambridge Street Pastors has been greatly blessed over the past 3 years by support from the Community Safety Partnership in the form of an annual grant of £5.000. We have been very grateful for this. However this support was provided on a 3-year programme and we have received confirmation that the grant cannot be continued in 2014. This has created a financial crisis for the next 6 months and we need to reach out to the community for urgent assistance.
