for community action (Hope Cambridge), and aid those in difficulty late at night (Street Pastors). National causes we have supported work to end poverty (Church Urban Fund, Children's Society) and stigma for those with mental health problems (MIND's Time to Change campaign). Internationally we have supported organisations serving those in major crises (Christian Aid for Northern Iraq and South Sudan, Disasters Emergency Committee Ebola appeal), providing education and home for disadvantaged children (Free a Dalit Child in India, Shearly Cripps Orphanage in Zimbabwe, Azul Wasi Orphanage in Peru), sharing Jesus' love through missions (Church Mission Society), and protecting biodiversity (A Rocha International). We have also supported a member of our congregation who volunteered for USPG helping in schools and a church in Belize. We are thankful for the tireless work done by people from these organizations, and the lives they transform by the grace of God. Sharon Neufeld
