Ridley24 is a 24hr "microfestival" held at Ridley Hall, running from Friday evening on **8 September** to the evening of Saturday 9th. It will include a range of speakers, artistic offerings, music and activities for children. The theme of this year's festival is "Joy" and the joyful climax of the event will be an open-air communion service on the Saturday afternoon with Bishop Stephen.
