APCM 2023: Our APCM will be on **Sunday 14 May** in the Hall after the Sunday service and Cafe Church. We will have the Annual Meeting – and then all are welcome to stay for **a bring and share lunch**. 14 May is the start of Christian Aid Week, so there will also be an opportunity to donate to Christian Aid at the meal.

Church Wardens, PCC members and Deanery Synod Representatives

Ian Nimmo-Smith, who has served faithfully and ably as a Church Warden for 9 years, has indicated that he will not be standing again for this position this year. We hope very much to have an opportunity to thank Ian warmly at the APCM for all he has brought to this role over these years. Maggie Fernie, our other Church Warden, who also brings so much to this role - especially last year in the ways she served during the Vacancy - has indicated that she intends to stand for another year. We hope to have an opportunity to show our gratitude to Maggie at the APCM too. With Ian stepping down, St Andrew's is therefore needing a new Warden to be nominated and elected at the APCM.

The Parochial Church Council (PCC) are the trustees of the charity of St Andrew's Church. They hold leadership and legal responsibilities, together with Wardens and the Vicar, for the flourishing of the Church. There are 12 elected posts on the PCC, of which 5 come up for renewal this year. 4 current

members of the PCC have indicated they wish to stand again and will need to be nominated and elected at the APCM. Robin Newton is stepping down after 3 years on PCC - so thanks are due to Robin at the APCM, for all he has shared in this role.

Deanery Synod is the forum for clergy and lay representatives across the North Cambridge Deanery. St Andrew's is entitled to nominate 2 lay representatives to this Synod - and who also serve as members of the PCC. These 2 posts come up for renewal this year too. Both our current Synods reps have indicated that they wish to stand again and will need to be nominated and elected at the APCM.

Wintercomfort Collection Box – donations of items: We continue to pilot having a Collection Box for items in church and thank you for all donations so far received. At the moment, the most pressing donation drive is for spreads to feed those who are rough sleeping, so: jams, marmalade, marmite, peanut butter, honey and chocolate spread. Donations must be shop-bought and sealed – no home-made please. You are welcome to bring any items to church on a Sunday morning and place them in the new Collection Box. We will make arrangements for a regular bulk collection to be delivered to Wintercomfort. As we move towards summer, Wintercomfort tell us their needs will change, and will update us regularly with items they are seeking.
