A Curate is coming to St Andrew's!

We are pleased to share the exciting news that we will have a new member join our ministry team in July. Steven McGregor will be ordained Deacon at Ely Cathedral on Sunday 2 July, and will serve as a part-time and self-supporting curate.

Steven has written the following message of introduction: Dear St Andrew's, My name is Steven McGregor. I will be joining the church this summer as a part-time and self-supporting curate. I know some of you already, as we have lived in Cambridge for many years. Indeed, my wife, Celina, and our three children Lydia (6), David (2), and Elizabeth (1) were all born here. As for me, I am from Florida originally. Before training for ordained ministry, I spent some time in the air force and army and later worked in London and academia. I have had the privilege of writing a book on the Battle of Midway and when I am not helping to care for our young family, I enjoy reading and writing history. And a Bishop is leaving Ely!

It was announced on Wednesday that the Bishop of Ely, Steven Conway, will be moving to be the next Bishop of Lincoln. Bishop Stephen has come to St Andrew's on numerous occasions for Confirmations and most recently for Philip's installation in December. Bishop Stephen is likely to lay down his bishop's pastoral staff in mid-July, and after that Bishop Dagmar will be Acting Bishop of Ely until a new Bishop of Ely is in post.

Bishop Stephen wrote a letter to all of us in his diocese, saying the following: "I have loved the nearly thirteen years I will have served the gospel with you. It will remain my most sustained commitment in ministry, a time of great fruitfulness for me and, I trust, a time of shared purpose and love in Christ Jesus. ... I have sought to lead and to teach by word and example. I am sorry where I have failed or fallen short. I am deeply grateful, my sisters and brothers, for all I have learned from you about our shared faith in Jesus and our eternal salvation in him. It has been a huge privilege to have baptised and confirmed so many people embarking on the journey of faith and discipleship. I shall take all this learning and encouragement with me to Lincoln. ... I shall go on praying for the flourishing of the

mission and ministry of all our churches, schools and chaplaincies, and for the well-being of their ministers. Please continue to pray for me. +Stephen

Some side aisle pews to go on loan. A former Curate of St Andrew's, Helen Orr, who still lives in the parish, is creating a chapel in her garden which she intends to make available to any who would like to go and use the garden for contemplation. While Nick was still Vicar in 2021, he explored with Helen a mutually beneficial arrangement where a small number of the spare and under-used (modern reproduction) pews in the St Andrew's side aisles might be loaned for use in this chapel within the parish. In addition to pews, it was also thought appropriate that the former Communion table, currently at the back near the South door, might be loaned for use in the chapel space. Nearly a year ago, at the PCC meeting on 11 July 2022, during the vacancy, the PCC unanimously agreed to this proposal, seeing significant advantages for St Andrew's. As the pews are on loan, they or the table could be returned to the church at any time if required. The space this loan would leave in the side aisles will enable us to develop our children's area further, and provide better circulation space for coffee serving and other uses. After some delay, we now expect the pews to be carefully transported from the church in the next few weeks. - Maggie Fernie and Chris Pountain, Church Wardens
