Weekly News Update, 16 June 2023

Thank you to everyone who came to help with the **Spring Cleaning and Sorting Morning** last Saturday. It made a real difference to the tidiness of some areas of our church, and has created some additional space for us to trial some small adjustments in arrangements in the side aisles - including making the children's area a little larger. In this last week, six pews and a table have been moved from the church, as planned and agreed by the PCC. This is called a temporary reordering arrangement, with pews and table to be used in a chapel space off Thrift Walk belonging to Revd Helen Orr. This arrangement is for up to 2 years. If you would like to speak to Philip or the Wardens about how we can improve our church interior space to serve our worship and welcome, please do so.

Saturday 17th June, 9.30am-12.30pm will be our next **Churchyard Working Party**; and apart from gardening we will have a display table with information about what we are trying to do and inviting people to come and join in the work. One job will be to return Wimbledon to its usual shorter condition and also make the bike racks a bit easier to use. That Alexanders (plant) grows and grows! If you are coming to join us, please, if possible, bring a rake as the grass has been cut, as one worthwhile task is the raking and gathering. Thank you to all for helping us cherish our churchyard.

Also on **Saturday 17 June, 12 - 4pm, Chesterton Active Families Festival** will be held on Pye's Rec. Organised by Cambridge City Council. Featuring cultural activities and food by the Cambridge African Network Association, playzone, dance sessions and more. All welcome.

Changed Pattern of Sunday 10am Services in July and August. Our usual pattern of varied styles of Sunday morning service will change slightly for July and August, to make adjustments for annual Vassa Day and the school holiday season. The pattern will be as follows:

Sunday, 2 July, All-age Communion

Sunday 9 July - Sung Eucharist

Sunday 16 July - All-age Communion

Sunday 23 July (Vassa Day) - Family Service including Baptism of Millie Halls. A short Communion will follow refreshments, as on a typical first Sunday of the month.

Sunday 30 July- Sunday 3 September (inclusive) - All-Age Communion

Our 10am service on Sunday 3 September will include the baptism of Xander Adekunle.

Church Building Repairs Project - Every 5 years, our precious Grade 1 listed church building has an architect's Inspection, and we receive a report indicating where repairs are needed, and which are especially urgent. Our most recent (Quinquennial) inspection was in 2021, and a wide range of repairs were considered urgent(!) - to our roofs, the upper windows, the stonework, and, most visibly, replastering and repainting the side aisle walls, with recommended work on the drainage gulleys to the south of the church. Two years have now elapsed since this report, and so it is high time this work was done, in order to safeguard the building fabric from damp and the weather, and restore its beauty for all who enjoy this space for prayer and worship.

This past week, the PCC agreed to carry out this work, accepting one of three tender quotations - the chosen bid being from FA Valiant, a firm we worked well with for our ramp, accessible toilet, and other recent projects.

Giving the go ahead to this project commits the PCC to a very considerable expenditure - c.£70,000 in total. The Friends of St Andrew's have kindly offered to make supporting this project their current appeal. Both the Friends committee and the PCC recognise that delaying this project i) risks ongoing harm to the fabric, ii) is only likely to get more expensive in these days of inflation, and iii) will in turn delay further improvements to the building we might like to pursue next. If, for example, we were seeking to move to a low-carbon heating system or solar energy generation, we know we would need to have fixed the roofs and addressed current damp issues in the walls first. Hence, it makes sense to carry out this project now.

Parochial Church Council (PCC) meeting summary 8th June:

PCC met on Thursday 8 June, 7.30pm. This was the first PCC gathering since the Annual Parochial Church Meeting in May. Peter Coomber, mainly of our 8am congregation, rejoined PCC and was welcomed, as was Chris Pountain as Churchwarden, formerly a PCC member anyway.

A summary of the meeting is as follows:

We agreed on some considerable expenditure on the work deemed the most urgent since our Quinquennial (5 yearly) inspection (see notice in Weekly News above). Much of this project has been agreed by the Archdeacon, but the improvements to the drainage need faculty permission, the Church of England's permission granting system for work on its historic building. We hope to gain this permission over the summer. PCC Fabric committee received three quotations for the project, and PCC members voted to accept the tender quotation from FA Valiant, as proposed by the Fabric Committee.

PCC were made aware of what we believe was a bit of half-term mischief in the church, nothing malicious. We were encouraged to note any unusual behaviour or activity we observe in the church or churchyard and, as ever, encouraged to come into church as we pass by or make a visit anyway so that we ensure we can keep our building open and ensure it is used appropriately. Reporting

suspicious activity in the churchyard to Rachel Clarke in the Church Office is also encouraged to keep a full record.

The Aumbry to the left hand side of the high altar at the East end of church is currently empty, and not being used for storing the reserved consecrated sacrament - as has been the case since Covid. For this reason, a candle is no longer being kept lit permanently in the red holder. The PCC and VIcar will keep this situation under review, but decided we did not want visitors to be misled about the presence of the reserved sacrament, implied by a lit candle.

We have 2 strong applicants for the Youth Worker post, with interviews to take place late in June. This news was greeted enthusiastically. We were notified of an intended swap between Cafe Church to 4th Sunday and Junior Church to 2nd Sundays from September, which will make half-term holiday period cover easier for those in future. Also that preparation of children aged 8/9 years would take place for receiving 1st communion at an All Age Communion service in July.

Rachel had prepared a proposal of work to carry out a long overdue refurbishment to the church office during the closure period in August. This will also take place in conjunction with work on the church archives seeking to centralise, rationalise and store them all in a secure location.

Philip was able to officially share the news of the new Curate Steven McGregor who will be ordained on 2nd July and be with us Sunday 9th July before a pre-booked family holiday after that. Philip would be absent for annual leave during August.

Michael gave us an update on Finance. Income is slightly up on last year giving a forecast deficit of £10,979. Forecast income assumes giving remains the same. We are still not 100% sure the insurance claim will be paid in full, as expected, for the damaged windows. As a PCC and therefore charity trustees, we are mindful of running a deficit budget and either need to increase giving or cut costs. The reintroduction of collections has made a significant difference in addition to the card machine at the back of church.

We had an annual review of 3 policy documents: Conflicts of Interest, Equal Opportunities and Complaints policies to update them and approve them.

We were given a certificate of thanks from the diocese for paying our Parish Share (£75,541.85) in full. [A copy is on the noticeboard in church.]

With the news that Bishop Stephen is leaving to be Bishop of Lincoln we were informed Bishop Dagmar, Bishop of Huntingdon would be acting bishop for Ely.
