Weekly News Update, 22 September 2023

Harvest Sunday is on 1 October this year. There will be a bring-and-share lunch after the morning service(s). The 10am Family Service will have a harvest theme - we will then break for refreshments followed by setting up in the hall for the lunch. There will be a short Communion in church at about 11.20am. We will aim to eat in the St Andrew's Hall by 12 noon (so don't have a big breakfast!). Sign-up sheets will be in church from this Sunday, with the opportunity to indicate the kind of food you intend to bring. Signing up allows us to estimate numbers, but all will be welcome on the day.

Harvest Collection for WinterComfort - Sunday 1 October

As in previous years, we are collecting donations during our Harvest Service for WinterComfort - a local organisation that provides practical help to those who are homeless in our city. If you would like to bring something to offer during the service, the list below offers some suggestions:

Food items

Dried pasta / Gluten free pasta / Rice
Noodles (dried or 'straight to wok' types)
Tins of tuna or ham
Tins of baked beans, chopped tomatoes, kidney beans, green lentils, sweetcorn or soup (any flavours)
Pasta sauces
Individual porridge pots
(Shop-bought only) jam, marmalade, chocolate spread, peanut butter
Jars of sandwich spread
Coffee or Tea

Please remember that WinterComfort is not allowed to give out home-made items, so if you wish to donate other items not on this list, ensure they are shop-bought. Many thanks.

Opportunities to help our communications as a church

We want to be a church that lets our community know what's on in our church and welcomes new people warmly and effectively. We are looking for new volunteers to

Quinquennial building repairs: arrangements in church from mid-August to the end of October. The work has been progressing well since it began on 14 August. The most disruptive part of the project involves removing and replacing plaster from the wall in the South Side Aisle. The South Side Aisle has been sealed off with plastic sheeting, and will remain out of use by the church for an estimated further 7 to 8 weeks.

For the duration of this period, the 8am Communion service is being held in the Nave area. The prayer area and votive candle stand has moved to the North Aisle.

The church remains open to the public in the usual way, but regrettably won't be as peaceful on weekdays when the work is taking place. The church may be closed earlier on some days.

Update on the Hearing 'loop' in church: The hearing 'loop' in church is currently out of action because of the building work in the south side wall. We are very sorry that this has been a consequence of the work on the wall - and our technical volunteers are looking into options to restore this as soon as possible.
