Lighting in church. Those of us who have been in church recently on darker mornings or for evening events and services will have noticed that fewer lights are working than we would expect. Unfortunately, recent attempts to solve this by changing the bulbs have revealed that the fault lies with many of the light fittings - a number of which have failed at the same time. To improve the lighting in the short-term, we plan to introduce some stand-alone lighting. The PCC has recognised and agreed the need to bring forward a long-planned project to upgrade to an energy-efficient and flexible lighting system, and to find the funds for this as soon as possible. Please bear with us while the project is planned and implemented. If you have any views about our future lighting needs in church, you are most welcome to share them with Philip in the first instance.

Supporting Crossways hostel this winter

Last winter, as a church we supported the new Crossways pop-up homeless hostel in our parish by supplying milk (later milk and bread) on a daily basis from early November to the end of March. This project is part of the Cambridge Churches Homeless Project https://www.cchp.org.uk

We had a very generous response to our appeal last year, and commend this project to your support again this year. The St Andrews PCC Mission and Giving Subgroup have also assigned a donation to the project for a second year. There are paid weekday staff and weekend Christian volunteers who cook and support the residents. There are 20 occupied bedrooms once the hostel gets to full capacity. The milk and bread are delivered daily by the nearby Spar shop, on our behalf, according to the level of need.
