Derek served as Churchwarden, Chairman of The Friends of St Andrew's, and as a member of the PCC for a long period, in addition to supporting Lorna's calling to ordination and her valued ministry at St Andrew's. Please do remember Lorna and the whole family in your prayers. Derek's funeral service will be in Church on **Tuesday 14 November, 1.45pm**.

Supporting Crossways hostel this winter

Last winter, as a church we supported the new Crossways pop-up homeless hostel in our parish by supplying milk (later milk and bread) on a daily basis from early November to the end of March. This project is part of the Cambridge Churches Homeless Project <u>https://www.cchp.org.uk</u> We had a very generous response to our appeal last year, and commend this project to your support again this year. The St Andrews PCC Mission and Giving Subgroup have also assigned a donation to

the project for a second year. There are paid weekday staff and weekend Christian volunteers who cook and support the residents. There are 30 occupied bedrooms once the hostel gets to full capacity. The milk and bread are delivered daily by the nearby Spar shop, on our behalf, according to the level of need.
