# Weekly News Update, 8 December 2023

Jill Pratt's funeral will be on Thursday, 14th December, at 12.30pm at Jill's parish church of St Mary's, Fen Ditton.

Churchyard Working Party this Saturday, 9th December, 9.30 am – 12.30 pm with an end-of-year celebration: We decided to have a working party this coming Saturday as the next one felt a bit close to Christmas. We've done that in the past and had a little celebration and we'll do that this year too, with hot chocolate, tea and coffee, mince pies, etc. served at around 11 am. With the sudden icy, icy chill of the last week, the trees decided it really was time to let go of their leaves, so rakes, leaf rakes, those big plastic hands or pieces of cardboard to pick up leaves and gloves are going to come in handy. And looking at the forecast, there's only a 20% chance of rain at 10.00 and the temperature will be a whole 9! Do come if you can. *Maggie* 

Come decorate the Church Christmas Tree - this Saturday, 9 December, 2-3pm in church. All are welcome - young and old - to join in decorating the church tree beneath the chancel arch this Saturday afternoon at 2pm.

**Christingle - this Sunday afternoon at 4pm.** Our annual Christingle family service is the second Sunday in Advent. Come for 4 o'clock to decorate your own Christingle - and for a special service featuring Minims, our music group for young children. And stay for seasonal refreshments.

**Advent reading and reflection** - Advent is a season in the church's year when Christians have traditionally been encouraged to set aside time for reflection and personal prayer, as also in Lent - though, frankly, it's good at any time of year! It is during *Lent* that St Andrew's has a custom of meeting together in organised small groups, often centred on reading a devotional book together; and the intention is to revive these in February. Yet, as we enter Advent, if anyone would like a book recommendation for your personal reading and devotion in this time, I recommend Paula Gooder's *The Meaning is in the Waiting: the Spirit of Advent* (Canterbury Press, 2008). **Lighting in church.** Those of us who have been in church recently on darker mornings or for evening events and services will have noticed that fewer lights are working than we would expect. Unfortunately, recent attempts to solve this by changing the bulbs have revealed that the fault lies with many of the light fittings - a number of which have failed at the same time. To improve the lighting in the short-term, we plan to introduce some stand-alone lighting. The PCC has recognised and agreed the need to bring forward a long-planned project to upgrade to an energy-efficient and flexible lighting system, and to find the funds for this as soon as possible. Please bear with us while the project is planned and implemented.
